NARRAGANSETT, RHODE ISLAND- Man lost at sea since yesterday around 3pm as Navy and Coast Guard helicopters failed to find him last night, search to be resumed this morning, according to authorities.

At about 3pm yesterday, engaged couple Jerome Brindamour and Ann Perry joined by Paul Duhamel and Cindy Campbell, were walking on rocks at the end of Hazard Avenue in Narragansett, Rhode Island. When things took a turn of events.

Perry dropped her coat into the water and a wave caught it. Campbell tried to recuperate it, but in the process was struck by a wave and knocked into the surf. Once in the water, the current carried her away from shore.

A wave knocked Duhamel back into the rocks, cutting and bruising him after trying to help Campbell out of the water.

Brindamour attempted to swim to Campbell but the current kept the two away from shore, consequently, they were unable to get back.

Two boys who witnessed the incident called a Fire Department rescue boat. The boat reached the scene around 3:30 pm, by that time it was too late, Brindamour had already disappeared into the waters.

The fireman rescued Campbell. She was taken to South County Hospital and admitted for observation. As of now, she was reported in stable condition.
